GENERAL

At Hampshire Record Office we welcome personal visitors to the search room and strongly advise booking a microform machine in advance if you are likely to be using material such as parish registers, wills, censuses and the General Register Office indexes of births, marriages and deaths. For those unable to visit, all enquiries about holdings which can be answered using catalogues and indexes are answered free of charge, as are most short, specific requests which may require consultation of a document. A paid research service is available for more detailed requests and costs £15 per hour (2000 charge). A list of independent record searchers is also available.

GUIDE TO SOURCES

Hampshire Record Office collects records relating to Hampshire and Hampshire families, except where the primary connection is with Portsmouth or Southampton. We have published several guides to our holdings, which can be purchased at the Record Office or by post. These include:

INDEXES TO NATIONAL RECORDS

Four major national indexes are held:

- Civil registration indexes of births, marriages, deaths 1837-1992
- Principal probate registry indexes of wills and administrations 1858-1943, with indexes for the Prerogative Court of Canterbury, 1853-1857
- The International Genealogical Index (IGI) for England and Wales
- Index to the 1881 census for England and Wales

PARISH REGISTERS

The following are held:

- Deposited parish registers of parishes in the diocese of Winchester (except Southampton parishes) and parishes in the deaneries of Bishop Waltham and Petersfield within the diocese of Portsmouth.
- Microfiche copies of most Hampshire parishes, including those deposited at Portsmouth, Southampton and Woking.

GENERAL

The Isle of Wight Record Office collects records relating to the history of the Island and its inhabitants. No appointment is necessary to visit the Office unless you are planning to consult material on microfilm (e.g. parish registers, census returns, newspapers). For those unable to come to the Office, there is a research service available. A fee of £15 is charged for one hour search, and a maximum of three one hour searches will be undertaken. Full details of the search service and charges can be supplied on request. A list of local record agents who will carry out more extensive research can also be provided.

PARISH REGISTERS

Parish registers have been deposited by most parishes within the Isle of Wight. A complete list of parish registers and microfilm copies held at the Isle of Wight Record Office is given in *Parish Registers of Hampshire and the Isle of Wight*.

A card index at the Record Office includes all baptisms, marriages and burials on the Island up to 1900, as far as deposited registers and photocopies permit. The card index includes entries from Anglican, Roman Catholic and Nonconformist registers.

THE PITT COLLECTION

A Gentleman's Library built in the late 17th and early 18th centuries by William and Samuel Molyneux and Nathaniel St. Andre, particularly strong in works of political science, natural history (including botanical illustration) and history. This collection is available by appointment only. A printed catalogue is available.

MARITIME COLLECTION

This collection is of national significance. It consists mainly of books and periodicals on the Merchant Navy. Material includes works on sea-borne trade, voyages, the operation of ships, hydrographic charts and general maritime history. Shipping lines are strongly featured. As the collection and readers' requirements develop, coverage is being extended to include the history of

emigration and settlement. A printout from the computer-generated catalogue of the collection is available for consultation . The collection stands at around 6,000 volumes and is growing steadily.

The Hartley Library holds a considerable amount of material essential to the study of local history. Although the Cope Collection on Hampshire and the Isle of Wight is a well known source for local studies, within the general stock of the Library there are many other sources of information on Hampshire and on other areas of the country

The original Cope Collection was bequeathed by Sir William Cope in 1892 to the Hartley Institution, thence passing to the University, and since added to, is of immense value to those researching any aspect of Hampshire and the Isle of Wight.

Everything which could be found in print about this county is included. The Collection now consists of over 10,000 books, including many rare books, and pamphlets. 7 large albums of engravings containing many scarce examples, more than 4000 illustrations, including postcards, photographs and engravings, about 2000 maps, prints and posters, and various manuscripts and papers. All Cope books, pamphlets and periodicals are listed in the University of Southampton online catalogue available at <http://www-lib.ac.uk>

The Cope Collection is part of the Special Collections Divisions on level 4 of the Hartley Library. It is normally open at the following times; Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday 9.00am to 5.00pm; Wednesday 10.00am to 5.00pm. The collection is available for use by members of the University and to members of the public.

There is a Catalogue of the Bound Volumes in the Cope Collection in the Portsmouth City Records Office.

The Ford Collection of Parliamentary Papers can often provide quite detailed information on aspects of local life in which central government took an interest, such as education, poor relief, public health, etc. Professor and Mrs. P. Ford developed this fine collection and used it to produce their series of guides to parliamentary papers. The collection includes a set of Sessional Papers from 1801 and a facsimile reprint of those for 1715-1760. There are also sets of Cobbett's *Parliamentary History of England 1066-1803* and the later volumes of *Hansard*. The Journals of both Houses are held, the Lords Journal from 1509 and the Commons Journal from 1547. There are a number of guides and indexes to Parliamentary Papers.

MONUMENTAL INSCRIPTIONS

Since its inception, the Hampshire Genealogical Society has been recording the monumental inscriptions in the county's churches and burial grounds. These have all now been completed. Work is now in hand to record the municipal and parish cemeteries. Some of the larger municipal cemeteries have been completed and substantial progress has been made on many others by the efforts of small number of willing volunteers. The Society holds nothing for the Isle of Wight.

Where recording has been completed, indexed transcripts have been deposited in the Society's Manuscript Library, at Twyford, with the Society of Genealogists, with the appropriate Incumbent and the Hampshire Record Office. Written requests for information as to burial grounds completed should be addressed to A.C. Colpus, 5a Westfield Oaks, Westfield Avenue, Hayling Island, Hants. PO11 9AQ. The monuments both inside and outside Portsmouth Cathedral were recorded by A. I. Everitt in 1891 and are in his notebook in Portsmouth City Records Office. This is the only known record of the external monuments, which have since been removed.
